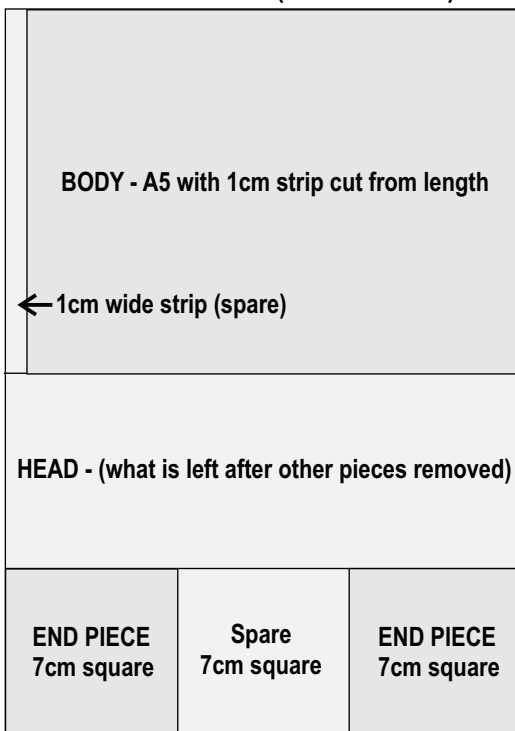


A 'novelty' gift box that doubles as a puppet. Move the lid up and down and the puppet will appear to speak!

thin card - A4 (210 x 297mm)



The head, body and ends are cut from one A4 sheet of thin card - coloured copy card (160g) is ideal. Use a paper trimmer if possible.

- **IMPORTANT** - Visit the **BOXING CLEVER** pages for detailed box making instructions. (Page 32)
- Put the lid (head) on the box (body) and make a pencil mark on one side of the body, level with the bottom edge of the lid. Cut and glue the paper 'chin', so that it comes below the mark.
- Cut and glue the strip of black paper that forms the 'mouth'. This should either be level with the mark or just a tiny bit below. If you show a little black when the lid is on, it will give you a mouth line.
- Cut, from coloured paper or card, ears, nose, eyes and anything else you wish. Perhaps a hat and/or hair? Glue in place carefully with the minimum of PVA.
- Make the nose any way you like. The one shown in the drawings is made from a folded rectangle of the card (see diagram). With the card still folded, make a new fold roughly where the dotted line is shown on the diagram. Fold it - unfold it - fold it the other way!
- Trim away the parts shown white, and glue to the head.
